The Order of Augustinian Recollects inaugurated its new novitiate at Antipolo on December 5, with ceremonies starting at 10:00 a.m.

Named, "Ezequiel Moreno Novitiate, this new OAR house located at Sra. de la Paz Subdivision, Antipolo, Rizal is a stage in the development of the novices, where they will stay for one year, then proceed to the next stage of their training for priesthood.

Rev. Fr. Charles Imas, OAR, Prior Provincial, at the time making his visit to the various OAR houses in the Philippines, was on hand during the blessing rites, where he presided in the unveiling of the marker, and the ribbon-cutting ceremony.

Most Rev. Msgr. Protacio G. Gungon, D.D., Bishop of Antipolo was the main celebrant during the ceremonies.


Lunch was served immediately after the inauguration and the blessing attended by numerous guests, including representatives from the different OAR establishments all over the country.

SOCIAL SERVICES OFFICE STAFF ON RELIEF MISSION

A relief team led by two Augustinian Recollect priests, Fr. Jose Maria Martinez, Father Superior and Fr. Nicolas Salvatierra, Vicar Parish Priest, together with the Social Services Staff motored to Zambales on November 29, 1991. They distributed rice, canned goods, noodles, chocolates, laundry and bath soap, and other necessities to the Aetas relocated in Cawag, Subic. This activity was part of the SSO's monthly relief operations for the benefit of lahar and typhoon Uring victims which claimed thousands of lives.

Another set of relief items was given away last Christmas.

In this issue of your Observer, we are reproducing this Papal Bull mainly, as an exhibit of a very important document related to the celebration, and secondly, to be able to satisfy the curiosity of many of our readers on what is Papal Bull.

A Papal Bull is the term applied to all official communications from the Holy Sea, at the Vatican, on specified occasions addressed to certain sectors of the church, regarding specific or special matters, as in the Canonical Coronation of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

CONGREGATION OF DIVINE WORSHIP AND DISCIPLINE OF THE SACRAMENTS MANILA

Upon the request of His Eminence Jaime Cardinal Sin, Archbishop of Manila, in his letter dated March 26, 1991, declaring the desire of the Clergy of the Faithful, the Supreme Pontiff, John Paul II benevolently grants that the precious image of the Blessed Virgin Mary, that is, Our Lady of Mount Carmel popularly venerated in the Parochial Basilica of San Sebastian, Manila, be crowned with precious diadem in the name and by authority of the same Supreme Pontiff.

Moreover, His Holiness wishes that this bounteous concession be expedited in a form of brief Apostolic Letter.

Notwithstanding to the least anything on the contrary. From the Office of the Congregation of the Divine Worship and Discipline of Sacraments, on the 8th day of May 1991.



The Valencia Parish Synodal Committee on Educational held a "Pulong-pulong" among the OAR Academic Community in Caidiocan and Valencia last October 7, 1991 to finish the last strength of consultation among the faithful, culminating the Recollect Parish active involvement in the preparation of th First Diocesan Synod of Dumaguete which is slated on January 20-24, 1992.

The two speakers, Mrs. Maria Cepe and Mrs. Teopista Eltanal, generally discussed the strength, goals and weaknesses of Catholic schools in the local church. They did emphasize the vital mission of all Catholic schools which is to develop the human person wholistically as explicitly pointed out by Vatican II.

The Coronation Mass, which highlighted the Canonical Coronation of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, last August 18. 1991, have been shown on several TV channels, as a result of the efforts by Ms. Tina Testa, an active member of the San Sebastian Parish, and who was one of the busiest individuals at the height of the August festivities.

First in the series of these TV presentations was on September 20 on Channel-9, followed by Channel 4, on September 27.

On October 11, 1991, Channel 9 gave it a replay, much to the delight of the parishioners in general, and in particular, those who were able to attend the colorful and once-in a lifetime presentation.

Noteworthy is the fact that during the Coronation Mass, featured were the combine voices of the Coro de San Antonio, and the U.P. Concert Chorus which were accompanied by the Philippine Philharmonic Orchestra, under the baton of Prof. Oscar D. Yatco. The selection featured was Mozart's Coronation Mass which was performed for the first time in an actual coronation.

The talk was followed by a workshop participated in by the student body which zeroed in on four important questions:

1. Are Catholic schools important instruments to strengthen the Christian life and faith of the people, most especially the youth?

2. How could a Catholic school help students who are poor financially?

3. What are your complaints against Catholic school?

4. How could the people help Catholic schools pursue their mission?

SS MISSION AND VISION REEMPHASIZED BY FR. LARLAR

In his regular dialogue with the members of faculty, Fr. Lauro Larlar, OAR, SSC President, re-oriented the faculty members on the mission and the vision of San Sebastian College.

In his talk, the Father President dedicated the attention of the faculty members to the three ways of looking at the San Sebastian College: One-looking at it as a secular institution, where there are no priests, no requirements for classes in Theology, and where Christian Dogmas and Christian living are not part and parcel of instruction given to students; Two-looking of San Sebastian College as A Catholic Christian Center, where the total formation of students within the Christian dimension is the preoccupation of everyone concerned; and three-looking at SSC as a Community of Augustinian Recollects.

In his brief discussion with the members of the faculty, the SSC President stressed the awareness of everyone on the Augustinian Philosophy of Communitarian life, and the development of man's interiority.

Communitarian living means that the community exists happily among themselves in the spirit of one big happy family, and in the same breathe, respect for the privacy of the individual, which is the interiority of man.

COMMERCE COURSE VALIDATED BY LONDON FIRM

The Institute of Chartered Shipbrokers of London has validated the SSC courses leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Commerce.

This move by the London firm, was an offshoot of the visit of its representatives, where immediately afterwards, in a letter addressed to SSC President, Fr. Lauro Larlar, OAR its Education Committee, officially came out with its decision.

As a result of this validation, students graduating from San Sebastian College's Institute of Commerce, who have completed their degree, with no failure will be exempted from the firms qualifying examinations.

For example, students completing their degree will be exempted from Introduction to Shipping. In addition they may be exempted from the Law of Carriage of Goods by Sea, Economics Sea Transport, and International Transport.

Further, for instance, a student majoring in Economics would be grant exemption from Introduction to Shipping and Economics Sea Transport and International Trade; a student majoring in Accounting or Banking and Finance would be exempt from Introduction to Shipping and Financial and Management Accounting.

FR. DIANA IS ASSISTANT CAMPUS CHAPLAIN

In the last issue of this publication, in the article, entitled New Faces at SSC, it has been erroneously reported that Fr. Danilo Diana, OAR newly assigned religious to San Sebastian College and San Sebastian Parish aside from being the Elementary Department Coordinator, is likewise, in a concurrent position, the "Asst. Campus Minister."

To rectify that mistake, this issue clarifies Fr. Diana's positions for the record, there are three positions which he holds currently, two at the college, and as one of the Assistant Parish Priests of San Sebastian Basilica.

At San Sebastian College, Fr. Diana is serving as Coordinator for Elementary Department, and as Asst. Campus Chaplain.

The difference between Asst. Campus Minister and Asst. Campus Chaplain according to Fr. Cornelio Moral, OAR, SSC Vice President, is that while a layman may occupy the position of a minister, only a religious may discharge the functions of a chaplain.

This publication extends thanks to Fr. Moral for that explanation which will serve to rectify a error, and at the same time a clearer delineation between the two titles.
